

The Mary - Mary the mother of Jesus, is one of the most revered figures in Christianity. According to the Bible, Mary was a young woman who was visited by the angel Gabriel and told she would give birth to a son, Jesus, who would be the Son of God. Mary was known for her unwavering faith and devotion to God, and she played a crucial role in the life and ministry of Jesus. She was present at his birth, his crucifixion, and his resurrection. Mary is often depicted as a symbol of purity and motherly love.

The Zacchaeus - Zaccheus is a biblical figure primarily known for his encounter with Jesus Christ. He was a wealthy tax collector who lived in the town of Jericho.
